

# SCENARIO CARD 1

## Medical Emergency Workshop Scenario

**Situation:** During a community work day, someone collapses. They're conscious but disoriented, complaining of chest pain and shortness of breath. The nearest hospital is 15 minutes away. 911 has been called but EMS arrival time is unknown due to other emergencies.

### Your Group Must:

- Assess the situation immediately
- Determine who leads this decision
- Decide on immediate actions
- Coordinate communication with EMS
- Manage bystanders and maintain calm
- Document what happened

**Decision Deadline:** 3 minutes

### Key Questions:

- Who has medical competence?
- How do we support their decisions even if we disagree?
- How do we coordinate multiple actions simultaneously?

# SCENARIO CARD 2

## Resource Allocation Conflict

**Situation:** Your community group has \$5,000 in emergency funds. Three members simultaneously need support:

- Member A: Lost job, faces eviction in 2 weeks, needs rent money (\$1,800)
- Member B: Medical emergency, needs procedure not covered by insurance (\$3,500)
- Member C: Home security system needed after break-in (\$1,200)
- **Total need:** \$6,500. Available: \$5,000.

### Your Group Must:

- Determine who leads this decision
- Establish decision-making criteria
- Make allocation decision
- Communicate decision to affected members
- Document reasoning for future reference

**Decision Deadline:** 3 minutes

### Key Questions:

- Who has relevant expertise (financial, medical, security)?
- How do we balance immediate needs vs. long-term impact?
- How do we maintain network relationships after difficult decisions?

# SCENARIO CARD 3

## Security Situation Workshop Scenario

**Situation:** Multiple community members report suspicious activity: unknown vehicle circling the neighborhood repeatedly, individuals photographing homes, attempted door-to-door "surveys" asking about security systems and schedules. Police have been notified but are understaffed. This is happening **NOW**.

### Your Group Must:

- Assess the threat level
- Determine who leads security response
- Coordinate immediate protective actions
- Establish communication protocols
- Determine information sharing (what's said publicly vs. privately)
- Create rapid response plan if situation escalates

**Decision Deadline:** 3 minutes

### Key Questions:

- Who has security competence?
- How do we coordinate multiple households?
- How do we balance security with operational transparency?
